BACKGROUND - 2020-21 VAC SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATES (A)

Veterans Affairs Canada will receive \$87.7 million in funding, representing a 2% increase over the current budget. Veterans Affairs Canada's budget will increase from \$5,237.7 million (\$5.24 billion) to \$5,325.4 million (\$5.32 billion) for the following:

- \$74.4 million for Vote 1 (Operating) for the Department's Service Excellence proposal (Budget 2020):
 - This funding will enable the Department to deliver on our top priority –
 reducing disability benefit wait times for Veterans.
 - This funding will enable faster decisions, reduce wait times for disability benefits, and ensure case management services for Veterans who need this support.
 - This funding will cover new teams focused solely on reducing the existing backlog and improving wait times for disability benefits.
 - The Department will also explore innovative measures to more efficiently process future applications.
- \$13.3 million for an increase in employee benefit plan costs (Statutory) related to new Personnel costs for the implementation of Service Excellence.
