

FINDING YOUR WAY **SCENARIO 1**: MISSING HUNTERS

Answer the questions and collect the special letter(s) at each checkpoint to find your lost neighbours.

Checkpoint one:	You arrive at a river. Your team uses your ATVs to cross the waters.
Question:	What is the name of the Second World War unit that later became the Canadian Rangers?

Checkpoint two:	You made it to the mountain pass. Your team follows the trail into the valley where the trap line is located.
Question:	What year were the Canadian Rangers established?

Question:	Approximately how many members do the Canadian Rangers have?

FINDING YOUR WAY **SCENARIO 2**: A DOWNED PLANE

An airplane is missing. Your Canadian Rangers Patrol Unit has been tasked with finding the bush plane that was expected in your community three hours ago. You know where the plane started and where it was going. You also know that the pilot radioed in a mayday from close to your village. Your team will travel by boat to this location. Answer the questions and collect the special letter(s) at each checkpoint to make your way to your end goal.

Checkpoint one:	You put your boat into the water. Your team sets out for an island to the south where the plane is thought to have crashed.
Question:	How many languages do members of the Canadian Rangers speak?

Checkpoint two:	Your boat scrapes up against unmarked rocks in the river. Your team navigates around them to continue on your route to the downed plane.
Question:	What colour shirts and hats do the Canadian Rangers often wear?

Checkpoint three:	Some rope gets tangled in your outboard motor's propeller. You need to untangle it before you can keep going.
Question:	What kind of serious threats do the Canadian Rangers keep an eye open for?

Checkpoint four:	You receive a radio report that another bush plane saw evidence of a crash. You check your map and confirm you're on the right track!
Question:	In how many communities do Canadian Rangers members live?

FINDING YOUR WAY SCENARIO 4: HELPING THE COMMUNITY

It has been a hard winter. You know that some people in your community could use fresh meat to help save on grocery costs and stay healthy. Your Canadian Rangers Patrol Unit decides it will head out to do some ice fishing to gather food for local elders. A good lake is located not far from your village and your team is heading out now. Answer the questions and collect the special letter(s) at each checkpoint to make your way to your end goal.

Checkpoint one:	Your unit's snowmobiles are gassed up and the trail to the lake is clear.
Question:	What is the name of the Second World War unit that later became the Canadian Rangers? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint two:	Downed trees are blocking the trail. You stop and use a chainsaw to cut a clear path.
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Question:	The Canadian Rangers are called the "eyes and of the North." Special letter(s):
Checkpoint three:	Deer appear on a nearby ridge. Your patrol stops to do some hunting.
Question:	How many languages do members of the Canadian Rangers speak? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint four:	You pass by a familiar clump of rocks and trees. You are getting close to your destination.
Question:	Where is No. 4 Canadian Rangers Patrol Unit based? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint five:	You can see the frozen lake through the trees. It's time to slow down because you know there can be weak ice in the stream that flows into it.
Question:	What percentage of Canadian Rangers identify as being Indigenous? Special letter(s):
Destination:	You reach the lake and quickly cut some holes in the ice. The fish are biting today and soon you have a big catch. Success!

FINDING YOUR WAY **SCENARIO 5**: MILITARY EXERCISE

It is time for a major annual military exercise with other Canadian Armed Forces members. Your Canadian Rangers Patrol Unit will be going on a hike as you help guide the participants across the remote terrain and teach the other soldiers some of your knowledge of this part of the world. Answer the questions and collect the special letter(s) at each checkpoint to make your way to your end goal.

Checkpoint one:	Your Patrol Unit hosts a learning session near your community. You teach everyone how you prepare food using local resources like caribou.
Question:	What colour shirts and hats do the Canadian Rangers often wear? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint two:	You start your hike with a group of Canadian Rangers and other Canadian Armed Forces members. When you hit a flooded section of trail you have to find an alternate route.
Question:	What year were the Canadian Rangers established? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint three:	A member of your group slips and twists an ankle. You must administer first aid and call for an ATV to come get them.
Question:	In how many communities do Canadian Rangers members live? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint four:	You rendezvous with a military helicopter. You will train your group members on evacuating injured people during an emergency.
Question:	Are Canadian Rangers part of the Canadian Armed Regular or Reserve Forces? Special letter(s):
Checkpoint five:	You practice signalling a military plane flying above you using a flare gun. This training will help prepare your group to respond in a crisis or for search and rescue missions.
Question:	What percentage of Canadian Rangers identify as being Indigenous? Special letter(s):
Destination:	You made it to the rendezvous point. Your group joins other Canadian Armed Forces members who were flown in from a warship off the coast. Success!
